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Supply Chain Transparency Statement

On January 1, 2012, The California Transparency in Supply Chain Act of 2010 (SB657), codified at California Civil Code Section 1714.43, went into effect in the State of California. The law was designed to increase the amount of information made available by the manufacturers and retailers regarding their efforts (if any) to address the issues of slavery and human trafficking in their direct supply chains.

As an independent petroleum distributor and retailer, Rinehart Oil Inc.'s main supply chain involves acquiring already refined or manufactured motor fuels from refineries in the State of California and transporting them to retail service stations, commercial businesses, government entities and agricultural operations throughout Northern California. Rinehart Oil Inc believes this type of activity and the activities of our suppliers is not inherently susceptible to violations of slavery and human trafficking laws. While Rinehart Oil Inc. has not undertaken action with the intent of specifically addressing California Civil Code Sections 1714.43(c)(1) - (c)(5), Rinehart Oil Inc. recognizes and respects all labor laws, including those addressing slavery and human trafficking, wherever we operate.

Obeying all applicable laws is the basis on which Rinehart Oil Inc. business ethics and moral standards are built. Rinehart Oil Inc.'s Standards of Conduct requires all Rinehart Oil Inc employees to obey all local, regional and federal laws where ever we operate, including laws regarding slavery and human trafficking. Rinehart Oil Inc trains employees on its standards so that each employee understands the substance of the standard and abides by its contents. Further, Rinehart Oil Inc. takes seriously all potential legal or standards of business conduct and ethics violations, and encourages all persons subject to its principles to maintain the highest standards of business ethics and integrity by reporting suspected violations to their supervisors or human resource managers.

Lastly, while we do not have a formal verification program, we do perform periodic assessments of our suppliers to evaluate and address issues relating to compliance with regulations and business codes of ethics, laws and in particular those related to the California Transparency in Supply Chains Act Disclosure (SB657).
